

### Korea-Australia Free Trade Agreement




### What does "KAFTA" mean for



South Korea has a population of 50.7 million and is now Asia's fifth largest economy and one of the world's 15 largest economies. South Korea is known for its population density, which is more than 10 times the global average and imports more than 70% of its food and agricultural products. Currently, 1% of vegetable imports into South Korea come from Australia (UN Comtrade Database, 2015) and consumer tastes and demand for luxury and high-quality food products are increasing.

The Korea-Australia Free Trade Agreement (KAFTA) reduces trade and investment barriers, making it easier for Australians to do business with Korea – our 4th largest trading partner. The Agreement, which started in December 2014, helps level the playing field for Australian exporters competing with those from the US, the EU, Chile and the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN), who benefit from existing trade deals with Korea.


